Introduction

Education determines the intellectual prowess of a nation and ensures a systematic and assured course towards prosperity. Developed nations have a system of uniform quality education available to all segments of the society in the formative stage through public and private schools. Unfortunately majority of our talented youth is deprived of this opportunity for a host of reasons and thus a Raison D'être for the creation of Al Mujtaba Education Trust.

Al Mujtaba Education Trust (AMET) was established in Jan 2016. After formulation of the Trust Deed and Bye Laws it was registered in February 2016 under Societies Registration Act, XXI of 1860 vide Registration No 47/2016. Thereafter, standard operating procedures (SOPs) regarding accounts, 'zakat' donations, selection of beneficiaries and monitoring procedures were prepared. Our Bye Laws stipulate the composition of the Executive Committee to run day to day affairs and job description of all members as well as employees. The Board of Trustees oversees the working of the Executive Committee and takes major policy decisions.

The Vision

Our vision is to break the 'poverty – illiteracy linkage,' so that no Pakistani child or young person should have to give up his/her educational pursuits for want of resources. We intend helping talented students to realize their true potential through scholarships and interventions to help address such resource gaps that affect quality of education being imparted to them. We visualize a state where every Pakistani child gets fair opportunities to become responsible and productive member of the society.

Mission

Provide financial assistance to talented boys and girls from poor families to enable them to study and excel in existing or higher quality schools, colleges and institutions of technology. Where necessary, assist educational institutions in improving teaching skills of their teachers.

Objectives

- Support education of needy talented students by bearing expenses on fees, uniforms and conveyance etc, and where necessary, have them admitted in higher quality institutions.
- Finance technical and vocational training for boys and girls having aptitude, thereby enabling them for suitable jobs.
- Support students having high grades to study in quality colleges to enable them to qualify for higher studies such as MBBS, MBA and Computer Science.
- Assist in capacity building in selected schools by organizing workshops and short courses in collaboration with NGO's etc.

Selection Criteria

Priority for Support

- Students of rural schools to be given preference.
- Students of private schools where Govt Schools are not available, inoperative or lacking specific subject teaching facility.
- Orphans to be given favourable consideration.
- Target areas for selection of beneficiaries will be based on reports by recognized NGOs and/or recommendations by Trustees/ Project Directors. Approval by Executive Committee will be mandatory.

Common Criteria

- Intelligent and Talented.
- Sound reputation of the family.
- Good academic record.
- Disadvantaged sections of society.

Specific Criteria

Cases will be recommended by Project Directors (PDs) for consideration and approval by Executive Committee which will meet on as required basis for the purpose. EC approval will be mandatory for award of scholarship. Minimum qualifying criteria and duration of support will be as follows: -

Selection Process

Designated Project Directors assisted by the Area Coordination Committees (ACCs) comprising of area notables and teaching staff of education institutions, facilitate the selection process. The selection process entails four stages that are explained in the following discourse.

Identification of Potential

We have adopted a multi-pronged strategy to select the most deserving students with requisite talent and potential for the optimum utilization of our donors' contributions. For this purpose, our preference is to acquire input based on personal knowledge of the heads of the institutions and apolitical notables of the area. However, beneficiaries are also attracted through advertisements in newspapers, brochures and our web site. We have also established rapport with some renowned technical institutes and NGOs like The Hunar Foundation, Sultana Foundation, Askari Institute of Technology and Anjuman Faiz Ul Islam to extend our support to the deserving students, who are finding it difficult to meet their expenses. Where necessary, we hold our own tests to select beneficiaries.

Selecting Beneficiaries

On receipt, the requests for support are scrutinized by the Project Directors and Scrutiny Committee jointly to determine the type and duration of the support. The support could be in terms of tuition fees, examination fees, conveyance or hostel charges as well as incentive stipends to students, who perform well in Government Schools where education is free. The support is finally approved by the Executive Committee.

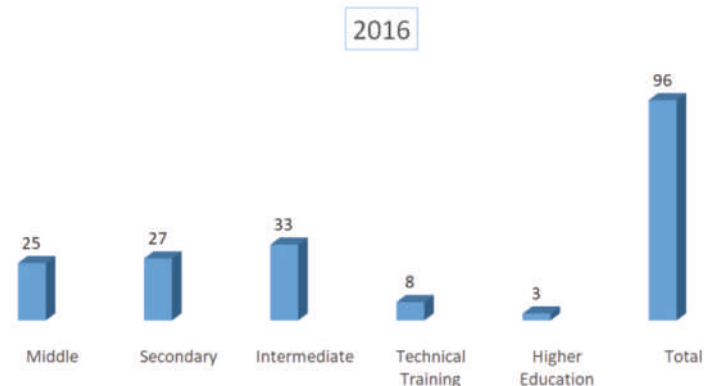
Monitoring and Counselling

This is the hallmark of our support system. The beneficiaries' performance is closely monitored through area based coordination committees or designated PDs for which regular meetings are held and progress reports acquired from the heads of the institutions. Corrective measures are taken where necessary and affected students are counselled by the respective heads of institutions as well as project directors/members of area coordination committees.

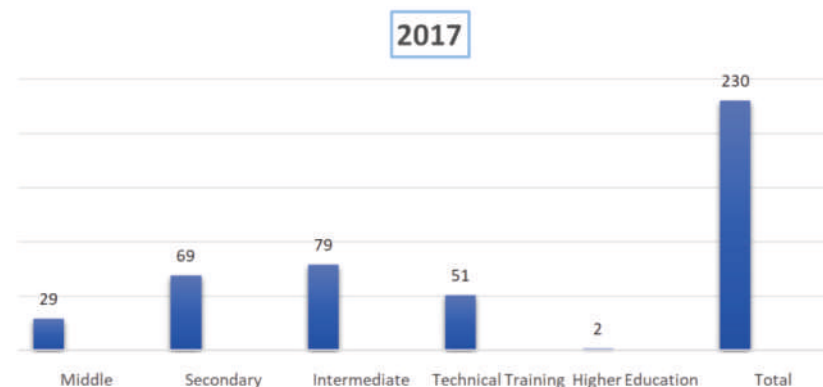
Review and Feedback Meetings

We are fully aware that there is always room for improvement and we therefore hold periodic meetings of the project directors with the Chairman. In Sha Allah it will continue to be a regular feature for the enhancement of our systems and procedures. Examination results are obtained from the respective institutions on regular basis. The results are evaluated and the students found not performing well are cautioned accordingly. The parents/guardians of such students are also advised to improve the performance of their wards. The students constantly not performing well are removed from support roster by the Trust.

An orphan from rural area Dhoke Kala Khan, District Rawalpindi. Her widowed mother works on odd jobs to make ends meet and is determined to educate her and her two younger brothers. Despite facing substantial hardships Sana secured 89 % marks in matric exams. She has been supported for studying at Sir Syed Science College for Girls. She secured 87% marks in 12th class board examination. She is aspiring to pursue higher studies.



Rahila Abdul Rehman

She belongs to a remote village near Jhang City and secured 94% marks in matric. Her father is handicapped and bedridden. She is dependent on her brothers who have meagre earnings. She has been supported for education at Chenab College Jhang by AMET and secured 89% marks in both 11th and 12th Class Board Exams. In view of her consistent good performance in studies and her family's desire to pursue higher education she has been admitted in 'Doctor of Physiotherapy (DPT)' program at The University of Faisalabad.

He has been selected for BSc Engg in Mechatronics in Army College of Electrical and Mechanical Engineering at Rawalpindi. He achieved a high GPA of 3.68 in the last semester exams.

He is son of a Retired Warrant Officer and belongs to Village Kandan, Tehsil Shapur, Distt Sargodha. In view of his good academic record, the Trust helped him shift from his rural school to Cadet College Sargodha. He ranks amongst high achievers of the Cadet College. Secured A Plus Grade in classes 9 and 10 board examination. He is now studying in class 12.



Sehrish Rauf

Sehrish Rauf is the daughter of an ex-soldier from Sillanwali, Sargodha who retired in 2006 and later died in 2015. She did her matric by securing 87% marks in 2013 and FSc with

82% in 2015. She abandoned the idea of becoming a doctor after the death of her father because of financial constraints and took admission in BS Zoology at University of Sargodha. She somehow managed to pay the fees of first two semesters and was on the verge of abandoning further education due to meager earnings. This is when AMET came to her rescue. AMET supported her financially to continue her studies for remaining six semesters by paying Rs 210,000/-. She has completed her education now by securing CGPA of 3.71 and was placed second in the course. Sehrish Rauf shall be awarded Silver Medal in the forthcoming convocation.

Cooperation with Other Organizations

The Hunar Foundation (THF)

The Hunar Foundation (THF) imparts technical training to the talented/needy youth all over Pakistan. A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) has been signed between THF and Al Mujtaba Education Trust (AMET) whereby part of the expenses amounting to Rs 5000/- per student per month are borne by AMET. 281 students sponsored by AMET have completed their training at THF campuses at Karachi, Tando Allah Yar and Kharian in the past 5 years. High achievers are selected to appear in City and Guild Examination, UK based NGO. Successful students are awarded City and Guild certificates improving their chances to get jobs in foreign countries. Almost 70 to 80% of the 281 students trained by THF have been employed in different industries.

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Specific Scholarships Schemes

Mazhar Scholarships

Mazhar Scholarships were instituted in June 2017 and funded by Rear Admiral (Retired) Syed Amjad Hussain through a donation Rs 2.0 million. Students were selected based on the criteria laid down by the donor. In all, 63 students (33 boys and 30 girls) were awarded Mazhar Scholarships for the year 2017 and 2018. Scholarship in question has been successfully completed and all the students have generally done well in their annual examinations.

Saeeda Naseem Scholarships.

Saeeda Naseem Scholarships were started jointly by Saeeda Naseem Trust and Al Mujtaba Education Trust in year 2018. Mr. Naseem Shafi, Chairman Saeeda Naseem Trust, donates Rs. 4.0 million annually specifically for education of girl students belonging to rural areas while half of this donation is being devoted to the vocational training of literate female segment of rural population. Details are as follows: -

- Year 2018/19. 43 girl students belonging to rural areas were awarded Saeeda Naseem Scholarships.
- Year 2019/20. 95 girl students selected from rural areas were awarded scholarships.
- Year 2020/21. 52 girl students selected from rural areas have been awarded these scholarships.
- 190 girl students from rural areas have been benefitted by the Saeeda Naseem scholarships so far in the past 3 years.
- 240 girl students from rural areas have been imparted vocational training through Saeeda Naseem scholarships. Most of these girls are stitching clothes of their village mates and supplementing the family income.

Vocational Training

Concept:

A large segment of the rural female population continues to be “unskilled” and is thus under-utilized with subdued contribution to the society at large and their families in particular. Responding to this need, it was decided to set up Vocational Centers in the rural areas for girls. Three vocational centers (VCs) have been set up in the rural areas at village Chawali, District Chakwal, Chak 118-NB, Tehsil Sillanwali Distt Sargodha and Danda Shah Bilawal, Distt Chakwal.

Objectives:

- To equip the literate segment of rural female population (Primary and Middle Education) with elementary skills enabling it to enhance the economic capacity of the family as a whole without much displacement.
- To equip the educated segment of rural female population (Matric and above) with advanced skills enabling it to move to urban areas thus enhancing its financial capacity.

Courses Conducted.

Six courses of 06 months duration each have been conducted at the respective VCs during years 2018 to 2020.

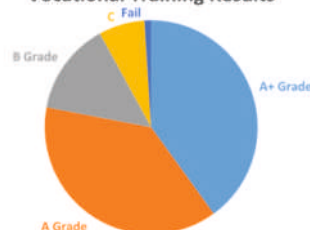

Accordingly E learning was started in five schools of Baffa District Mansehra and one in Bewal in Distt Rawalpindi in collaboration with E Ustad Foundation in April 2018.
- A yearly evaluation trip in July 2019 by Brig Kamran Sharif (Retd), Head E- Ustad Foundation, to 3 schools of Baffa showed a significant improvement in results of all major subjects and overall results of the schools concerned. The programme has now been introduced in Kaghan Memorial Trust School also. Additionally LCD alongwith SD card have been donated by E- Ustad Foundation to Digital Library Baffa for open access to the interested students.
- Efforts are in hand to widen E learning usage.

Certification of Al Mujtaba Education Trust by Pakistan Centre for Philanthropy (PCP)

- PCP conducted evaluation of AMET on 25 and 26 Sep 2018 for years 2016, 2017 and 03 Oct 2020 for the period covering years 2017, 2018 and 2019. . Staff checks were carried out by PCP team evaluating the following aspects at length:-
 - Internal Governance.
 - Programme Delivery.
 - Financial Management
- PCP team expressed its satisfaction over the education programmes being conducted by AMET, awarded 70 percent marks during year 2018 and 83 percent during year 2020 to the Trust. PCP team presented its evaluation report to the certification panel who have certified the Trust for 3 years (years 2021 to 2023). Certificate to this effect has since been awarded by PCP.
- Certification by PCP has led to the following advantages for AMET: -
 - Enhanced the credibility of the Trust amongst contemporary NPOs.
 - Paved the way to approach FBR for grant of tax exemption on donations which is the earnest desire of our donors.
 - Trust has been entitled to apply for financial assistance of Central Zakat Council.

Award of Tax Exemption On Donations by FBR

AMET applied for Tax Exemption on donations to FBR. FBR conducted a staff check followed by the visit of Income Tax Commissioner to AMET Office. Having satisfied themselves with the activities of AMET, FBR awarded tax exemption on donations till 22 Nov 2020. FBR has been requested to grant tax exemption afresh in the light of 2 nd certification of AMET by PCP. The case is under process.

Annual Audit of Accounts

- Amir Alam Khan & Co, a QCR rated audit firm, audited Trust accounts of years 2016, 2017 and declared these satisfactory.
- Responding to the requirements of PCP, current auditors of AMET were replaced by Shahzad Qazi & Co. They audited the accounts of years 2018, 2019 and found these in order.
- Accounts for Fy-2019/2020 have been audited by Amir Alam Khan and Co and found satisfactory.

Registration of AMET with Economic Affairs Division (EAD), Govt of Pakistan

Responding to the requirement of our foreign donors a case was taken up with the EAD for registration of the Trust with them. Required details were submitted to the EAD which they got verified through Intelligence Bureau and Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Resultantly AMET stands registered with EAD and MOU to this effect has been signed. Trust can now receive foreign donations in its bank accounts in Pakistan through "on Line Transfer".
