**The Cause**

‘Universal and Equitable’ opportunities for education are essential to unlock the intellectual prowess of a nation and ensure an assured march towards prosperity. Our potential workforce, fed by 255 million strong population, dominated by 167 million (67%) youth (thirty years or less), are our potential strengths that would be the envy of any nation. On the flip side, the low literacy rate of 60%, the 26 million children out of school and the deplorable Human Development Index (HDI) rank of 168 (out of 193) nations, impose crippling vulnerabilities on national security and progress. The uneducated and unskilled are akin to a time bomb waiting to blow up which can be defused only through a national effort. All stakeholders, the public and the private sectors, must join hands on war footing for this highest priority national project.

Majority of our youth, though blessed with tremendous potential for innovation, diligence and desire to be educated, face difficulties in accessing educational opportunities. The reasons are many, the central one being resource constraints. Pooling resources in conjunction with

Established in early 2016, Al Mujtaba Education Trust (AMET) is a non-profit, non-political NGO registered under Societies Registration Act. The field of activity is education with the focus on '**facilitating talented and needy students to realize their educational ambitions**'. The Trust is managed by volunteers and funded through donations by philanthropists and 'CSR' commitments from the commercial sector.

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We strive to contribute towards the creation and sustenance of an environment where talented and needy students have access to scholarships and interventions that address resource gaps affecting realization of their true potential. **We visualize a state where every talented and needy child gets fair opportunities to become a responsible and productive member of society.**

### Objectives

- Support education of needy and talented students by bearing expenses on fees, and other essential expenses related to education.
- Facilitate technical and vocational training for boys and girls who have aptitude, thereby enabling them for suitable jobs on a fast-track basis.
- Establish Educational/ Vocational/ Technical Training facilities at selected rural/ urban areas.
- Support students demonstrating good academic record and desirous of higher education to enable them to graduate in disciplines of choice.
- Assist capacity building in selected schools where such facilitation has convergence with objectives of the Trust.

## Scholarship Policy

At the heart of our efforts is a keen concern for ensuring merit-based allocations for scholarships. The scholarship award policy is keyed to cogent quantifiable and qualitative evaluation measures. Transparency in selection is ensured through consideration of each applicant by a committee to eliminate bias and personal preferences while continuation of scholarship through academic calendar is pegged to strict performance criteria. Salient points of the policy are enumerated below. Following principles anchor the scholarship policy: -

- ❖ Incorporation of fair criteria based, and transparent selection process.
- ❖ Equal opportunities for girls and boys.
- ❖ Maximization of outreach to extend benefits to all areas of the Country.
- ❖ Maximization of coverage of education streams.
- ❖ Sustainability.

**Categories/Levels of Education.** Students of following education streams are eligible: -

- Secondary (SSC) and Higher Secondary School Certificate (HSSC) levels.

### **Tanzeela Jamil**





In recognition of her talent and commitment to academic excellence, she was selected for AMET scholarship to pursue BS Medical Laboratory Technology (MLT) at Riphah International University Islamabad. She has successfully completed her 6th semester with a remarkable SGPA of 4.0 and a cumulative GPA of 3.97. She is deeply inspired and determined to give back to the community and contribute to AMET's endeavors in the future, In Sha Allah.

- Vocational/Skill Training Courses
- Technology Courses. Skill Certificates, Diploma and Certificate Courses in contemporary disciplines, Diploma Associate Engineer (DAE) Courses.
- Higher Studies (Graduation) at university level less PhD/M Phil.
- **Vocational Training in Rural Areas**. Residents of rural areas are eligible irrespective of education qualifications or age. Preference is given to SSC (Matric) qualified girls.

### **Selection Criteria**

- Talented students from economically challenged families are eligible. The following criteria are applied: -
  - Good Academic Record. Must have scored minimum A Plus grade marks in previous formal examinations with priority to: -
    - Students at rural Govt schools and less developed areas of the country.
    - Students at private schools where Govt schools are not available, are inoperative, or lack specific subject teaching facility.

**Dr Qurat-ul-Ain**



Dr. Qurat-ul-Ain was recipient of Al-Mujtaba Education Trust Scholarship since Matric and is now a medical doctor. Her sentiments in her own words, **“My association AL-MUJTABA EDUCATION TRUST has been exceptional. - Orphans, single parent students.
- Recommended by administration of school where enrolled and/or Trustee.
- Extreme need cases with low academic profile are supported on a case-to-case basis based on any of the following criteria: -
  - Personal information of Sponsor/Project Director (PD)
  - Recommendations of community representatives.
  - Any other reliable source of information.
- Continuation of support is subject to academic performance. Achievement of the following minimum grades is mandatory: -
  - Higher Education. Minimum 70% or equivalent GPA (2.75).
  - DAE. Minimum 60%.
  - Basic Education. Minimum 70%

**Faiz Rashid**



Faiz Rashid, an orphan, was sponsored by the Trust in Cadet College Sargodha. He is the 1<sup>st</sup> AMET sponsored cadet to join the Pakistan Military Academy and now serving in the army as Commissioned Officer.

### Selection Process

- **Budgetary Allocation**. The number of beneficiaries to be supported depends on resource availability for the academic year. Balanced distribution of funds is aimed at on following basis: -
  - Continuation of scholarships for enrolled beneficiaries to ensure **assured support till completion of course**.
  - Donor preferences for streams of education or specific students to be supported.
  - Balanced distribution amongst genders, geographical areas, and education streams. The number of students for each level is determined on an annual basis.

- Budget estimates and targets set for different levels of education are approved by the EC on yearly basis.

### **Identification of Potential Beneficiaries**

- Students meeting Trust criteria can apply directly for scholarship. Prescribed application form is downloadable from Trust website ‘[almujtaba.pk](http://almujtaba.pk)’ or can be acquired from Trust office.
- Trustees nominated as ‘Project Director (PD)’ recommend potential candidates for AMET support and facilitate their selection process.
- Tests/interviews are conducted by AMET if considered necessary.
- Donors may nominate specific cases for award of scholarships out of their donations. Such nominations are included as a special category but approval by EC is mandatory. In case the EC considers a nomination at variance with Trust policies, alternate names will be requested or proposed for concurrence by the donor.
- Frequency of Selection. Selection of beneficiaries is carried out in accordance with academic schedules of institutions. Exceptions may be considered on case-to-case basis.

### **Support Package**

- Financial support levels vary in accordance with the needs of beneficiaries.
- While all expenses related to education including fees, transport/hostel charges, exam fees etc., are eligible, actual grants are made on the required basis as decided by the EC.
- Sustainability for the entire duration of the course is ensured.

**Monitoring and Evaluation.** PDs engage with students, parents, and respective academic institutions. Monitoring activities are: -

- Academic results and release of funds allocated to students through academic semesters/years.
- Counseling of students to facilitate grooming and focus on studies. Scholarship is terminated in case of persistent poor grades.
- Resolution of issues having potential to impact studies.

### Education Streams and Scholarships

With a humble beginning of 96 scholarships with a financial outlay of Rupees 6 million, and catchment area of students limited to a few districts, AMET activities have grown at a steady rate, thanks to our generous donors. We have been able by the grace of Allah to serve over six thousand students to realize their educational dreams. Over a hundred students have

graduated in medicine, engineering, science, management and social



Malik Jabran Arif belongs to rural area Chak Beli. He was selected for scholarship on recommendations of a social worker. Son of a daily wage earner, he was facing difficulties in meeting educational expenses at the Institute of Space Technology. He graduated with a CGPA of 3.48. In his words, "I always dreamed to use my knowledge and skills for the betterment of my country. I am indebted to 'Al Mujtaba Education Trust' for helping me when I needed support without which I could not have continued my studies in BS Space Science. Looking ahead I plan to earn MS degree in Space Technology. My association with AMET has also motivated me to help others like me in any way I possibly can". Jabran is now doing MS in France, his dream is becoming a reality.

disciplines. A similar number have acquired Diplomas as Associate Engineers while those who earned skill certificates and completed education levels of Matric and Intermediate are in thousands. Many of our Alumni are gainfully employed having successfully transitioned from students to productive members of society. Employment trends of our Alumni – 50% for Higher Education Graduates, 55% for Associate Engineers and 70% for Skill Certificates – are encouraging and we hope that with the knowledge and skills acquired it is only a matter of time that the statistics improve. In addition, over fifteen hundred girls from rural areas have acquired vocational skills. Our geographic spread has also increased manifold with presence in almost 50% of the districts of the country. While our progress is a matter of satisfaction, we are cognizant of the need for more effort.




Number of student districts supported by Almujtaba



# Al-Mujtaba Trust: Academic Excellence & Student Achievements

As we keep our programs under review, it is a matter of satisfaction that results achieved by our students ratify our faith in their potential and robustness of our processes and efforts for outreach. The following figures portray the high percentage (70%) of students who achieved A+ and A grades since inception.



## Fast Track Programs

In recognition of the importance of fast-track employment for certain segments of society, AMET has integrated support packages for students inclined to and in need of education paths that facilitate quick start to careers. The programs ensure that students entering these streams keep open options for pursuing higher education should they need to later. Support for three streams is provided: -

- Diploma Associate Engineers (DAE) - three year post matric program
- Skill Certificate Course – Three months to one-year Certified Technological Skills and IT courses at institutes approved by NAVTTC/TEVTA
- Vocational Training for Rural girls.

## Partner Institutes

We value associations with certified institutes and remain open to join hands working for the common cause of education. Such partnerships help ensure quality education, facilitate effective identification of target sectors and post selection progress

### Maria Afsar



Maria Afsar is from Mirpur AK. Her father's salary as security guard was insufficient to allow higher studies despite her talent and desire. She was awarded scholarship for 'Diploma in Physiotherapy (DPT)' at the University of Faisalabad (TUF) where she completed her course with a CGPA of 3.47 and earned employment as physiotherapist for Special Children, in her hometown. As a gesture of gratitude and in accordance with her father's wish, she donated her first salary of Rs 25,000 to AMET. Her generous spirit to pay back to society reflects our positive cultural values and kindles great hope. It also endorses the viability of our organizational vision of '**breaking the illiteracy dropout linkage**', through educational opportunities to needy and talented students.

- Located in rural Islamabad - DAE programs - 8 to 9 students annually.

- Offers multiple programs - DAE and B Tech programs.

## Govt Polytechnic Institute Sardar Garhi, Peshawar



- Predominantly serving erstwhile FATA areas - DAE programs.

## Govt College of Technology, Kohat



- Offers short skill courses, DAE and BTech programs.

## National University of Technology (NUTECH)



- Islamabad based / other campuses - DAE and B Tech programs.



**Urooj Bibi** hails from remote village Malaand, KPK. She was pursuing BS Psychology at Riphah International University but struggling to meet expenses due to sudden illness and premature retirement of her father. Considering her need and in recognition of her determination for education, she was selected for scholarship. AMET support and her hard work facilitated her to complete her studies with a remarkable GPA of 4 in her final semester overall CGPA of 3.90. Alhamdo LiLLah, now she is gainfully and happily employed with 'Helping Hands', supporting her family and paying back to the society.

## Vocational Training



Girls from rural areas possess tremendous talent. When provided with opportunities they display great enthusiasm and energy in learning new skills. Unfortunately, a large segment of rural female population remains unskilled and unable to utilize their true potential. Responding to this situation, seven Vocational Centers (VC) have been set up in rural areas. The program has been possible due to the generosity of Trustees who dedicated their personal properties for the centers at Silla Wali, (Distt Sargodha), Chawali, (District Chakwal), Bucha (District Rawalpindi), Rera, (District Bagh), Baffa (District Mansehra), Jewra (District Rawalpindi) and Khabeki (District Khushab).

**Courses Conducted.** Two six-month 'Dress Making' courses per year are conducted. 'Basic Computer Training Courses' have been added at two centers in 2024. Similar initiatives will be undertaken at all centers as resources become available. Curriculum includes general awareness and motivational, religious enlightenment. Emphasis on soft skills in training programs has been incorporated with a view to generate social awareness and harmonious relations amongst their communities.

Due to the demanding routine, it became difficult for him to put in the hours of work necessary to earn enough for payment of fees. He was on the verge of dropping out, when he was selected for AMET scholarship. He has since graduated and as he seeks suitable employment, he remains engaged in teaching children driven by his motivation to pay back to society.

## AMET Education Complex



To expand our impact, AMET has initiated construction of an Education Complex on a 1.87-kanal amenity plot allotted by DHA Islamabad in 2024. Construction commenced in mid-2025 and is expected to be completed by end 2026. This seven-story building, estimated to cost PKR 300 million, will serve as a hub for education, skill development and community uplift. Key features of the complex include: -

- Paramedics Training Center
- IT & Digital Skills Training Hub
- Foreign Languages Programs for Export-Oriented Skilled Workforce
- Innovation & Emerging Skills Hub.
- Teachers' Training Institute for Government Schools
- Islamic Library & Prayer Hall
- AMET Administrative Offices

We hope and look forward to generous contributions and support from philanthropists, well-wishers and the corporate sector to join hands in this endeavor to transform lives.

### **Certification of Al Mujtaba Education Trust by Pakistan Centre for Philanthropy (PCP)**

PCP conducted 3rd Evaluation of AMET from 25-26 Jul 2023 for the period covering years 2020, 2021 and 2022. Staff checks were carried out by PCP team evaluating the following aspects at length: -
